With 66 hectares shared between two Châteaux and 5 Appellations (Bordeaux, Bordeaux Superior, Crémant de Bordeaux, Bergerac and Côtes de Bergerac), the Fournier family offers a wide range of wines!

The Château de Bonhoste, **certified High Environmental Value since 2013**, leads its vineyard in traditional culture mode and reasoned fight .

Indeed, they select and control yields, optimizing maturation to better preserve during maturing the authenticity and a better expression of the qualities of the soil.



Aging in a cellar excavated 200 years ago,

Originally for the extraction of stone for the construction of Bordeaux houses.

Since 1986, aging of wine in barrels and aging of the bottles are done in this cellar, which allows to offer the optimal conditions of conservation, with a stable temperature and a humidity rate of 100%.

The Château de Bonhoste was born in 1895 in the place called "**Bonhoste**" in the municipality of Saint-Jean-de-Blaignac where Bernard Fournier and his wife Colette settled in 1977 with the goal of creating Grands Vins de Bordeaux.

Located at 45° parallel, **Bordeaux** enjoys a temperate climate, favorable to the vine.

The Château de Bonhoste is located opposite Saint-Émilion, on clay-limestone soil, with good drainage potential.

It is in this **mansion of the 11th century** whose tower remains the witness overlooking the Dordogne valley that will be born "Château La Moulière". In the 17th century, the archives of the commune of Gageac-Rouillac indicate "**the vine grower of the Moulière**" testifying that this place was always a wine exploitation. Acquired in 1948 by Mr. Bouchet, this property was then exploited by his daughter Juliette and then by his granddaughter Colette Fournier. **Exceptional site** for the vine since located on the slopes overlooking the Dordogne valley with a clay-limestone and flint subsoil, the terroir of Château La Moulière offers noble and harmonious grape variety.

In 2005, their children Sylvaine and Yannick, took over the two properties. Yannick after studies in viticulture and oenology deals with the technical part, Sylvaine graduated in management and economics manages the marketing.
